## Perspectives on land use and Property - 11. April 2018

This seminar is the result of cooperation between the The Norwegian University of Life Sciences (NMBU) and The Free University of Bozen-Bolzano (unibz). The project is initiated by The Department of Property and Law at NMBU, which has national expertise on property registration, valuation, expropriation, land consolidation, property development and the legal aspects of property and physical planning.

There is an increasing demand for internationalization of education and research, and to meet these goals we need to reflect on how to develop an international orientation in our professional environment. The aim for the seminar is to exchange research ideas and discuss the possibilities for future cooperation.

The institutions and rules that currently exist have emerged over time, largely under different social conditions than those we have today. From a local cultural perspective, domestic solutions can be perceived as obvious and appropriate. Nevertheless, experience suggests that impulses from other cultures and systems often bring progress.

From a Norwegian point of view, the region of Trentino-Alto Adige is highly suitable for comparative studies. The topography, economic living standards, and infrastructures are comparable. Regarding institutions, however, there might be substantial differences. Norway has three levels of government: State, county and municipality. The country is not a member of the European Union, but still in many areas bound by the rules of EU. Norway has had a high degree of public management and planning during the last 50 years. As a result, there are many strong state agencies, and municipalities exert much authority, especially when it comes to questions of land use.

Our hope is that the seminar will contribute to a wider horizon for research, education and cooperation between Norway and Italy.

#### Steinar Taubøll

Lawyer, educated at the University of Oslo, Norway. He also has education in geography, biology and spatial planning. He has worked for a long period for governmental environmental mapping services, and for the last 12 years he has been teaching law at master programs for spatial planning and property handling.
